Testing Protocol

Compassionate care visitors (end-of-life/terminal illness) are encouraged, but not required, to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test in advance of the visit.

Visitors to independent living villas are encouraged, but not required to have been tested negative for COVID-19 in advance of the visit.

Visitors to assisted living or nursing residents are required to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test in advance of the visit. The test was taken must be no longer than 14 days prior to the visit

Visit Directions

Must be screened, then proceed directly to the resident room

Must be screened, then proceed directly to the designated visitation area

Precautionary Guidelines

- ✓ Visits must be scheduled in advance, will last no longer than 30 minutes, visitors should arrive on-time, otherwise the visit time must be reduced to enable cleaning and disinfecting and the ongoing schedule to be maintained.
- ✓ There will be no more than two visitors at a time allowed to visit the resident.
- ✓ Visits for each resident MAY be limited to once each week, to ensure time is available for all residents to host visitors.
- ✓ Otterbein-Sunset is focused on safety, and therefore protocol requires no direct physical contact, masks and social distancing, throughout the duration of the visits.
- ✓ Pets are allowed, but must be on leashes and controlled at all times.
- ✓ Otterbein-Sunset will maintain a visitor log for contact tracing purposes.
- ✓ Visitors are encouraged to exercise caution between testing with social distancing, masking, and the avoidance of large gatherings.
- ✓ It is the responsibility of the visitor to arrange for testing in advance of the visit. We suggest you consult with your doctor, search online, go to a local Urgent Care or check for information on the Lucas County website www.lucascountyhealth.com and click on COVID-19 testing sites

Protocols may be updated periodically in alignment with active COVID-19 cases on campus and/or as the result of governmental regulations determined by the percentage of positive cases in the Lucas county.
